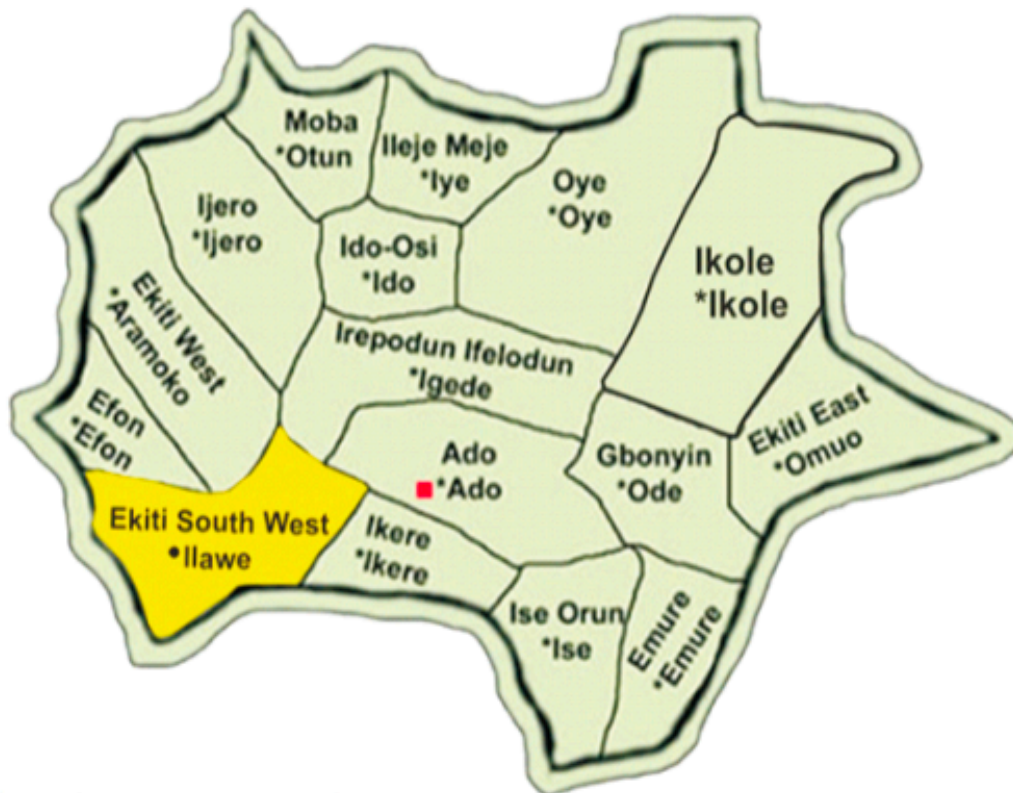

Introduction

This Community Development Plan (2024 – 2026) of Ekiti South West Local Government Area (LGA) outlines the development needs of the communities in the LGA. The Plan was developed through a collaborative effort of the LGA and community leaders. It outlines community needs and projects in the following areas: Water and Sanitation, Education, Health, Local Economy, Basic Infrastructure (Roads), and Security.

Benefits of the Community Development Plan

- * It helps the government to:
 - o Know the real needs of the people;
 - o understand the priority needs of the different communities; the various competing needs of the different communities that the government needs to prioritise when allocating resources for projects;
 - o wisely allocate government funds;
- * It makes it easier for the LGA and the state government to prepare their annual budgets;
- * It makes it easier for both the local government and the state government to harmonise their development efforts in the communities to avoid duplication of projects.
- * It reduces the siting of unsustainable projects in communities;
- * Communities and the LGA can use the plan to solicit for support for projects from prominent sons and daughters of the communities, corporate bodies, foundations and philanthropists.
- * Communities can also use the plan to engage their elected representatives to pick their constituency projects from the real needs captured in the Plan;
- * The Plan will help the LGA create a sense of belonging for members of the community, as they work together with government to solve their problems.

Brief Profile of Ekiti South West Local Government

Ekiti South West Local Government has its headquarters in Ilawe Ekiti. Sequel to the creation of Ondo State in 1976, Ekiti South West Local Government was established under the Local Government Edict of 1976 published in the Gazette as ODSL N5 of 1976. The effective date was September 1, 1976. The Local Government is comprised of 3 major towns: Ilawe, Igbara-Odo and Ogotun with 33 additional villages and farmsteads.

The population of the Local Government according to the 2006 Census figure is 165,277. It occupies a total landmass of 175,000 sq km. It shares boundaries with Ado in the North East, Ikere in the South East, Irepodun/Ifelodun in the Northwest, Ifedore Local Government of Ondo State in the South West, and Oriade Local Government of Osun State in the South East.

The people of Ekiti South West Local Government are homogenous in culture, tradition, and values. Indigenes speak the Ekiti dialect with slightly distinct intonations of the various towns and villages. The people are predominantly Christians and Muslims, while few practice the traditional religions such as Ogun, Ifa, Obatala, Sango, etc. Indigenes are mainly farmers and they grow cash and food crops such as cocoa, kolanut, oil palms, cocoyam, maize, cassava, banana, plantain, timber, bamboo, and vegetables among others.

How the Plan was developed

A team of volunteers made up of Community Leaders and Local Government Officers in the LGA were trained by our technical partner, Community Life Project (CLP), on how to carry out participatory needs assessment. The needs assessment was carried out over 3 weeks in the 3 major Communities and 67 sub-communities in Ekiti South West. The communities are:

The Team went around the communities and carried out Focus Group Discussions and Key Informant Interviews with different stakeholders to collate the pressing needs of the communities. The stakeholders that helped to identify the needs of the communities include: the Oba, Council of Chiefs, youths, women, Persons with Disabilities, Artisans, workers, health workers, and teachers.

The LGA team also visited health facilities and schools to ascertain the conditions of the facilities.

A Validation Workshop was organised to review the needs collected by the Needs Assessment Team. Present at the workshop were representatives of State Ministries, Departments, and Agencies, as well as the Community Needs Assessment Team.

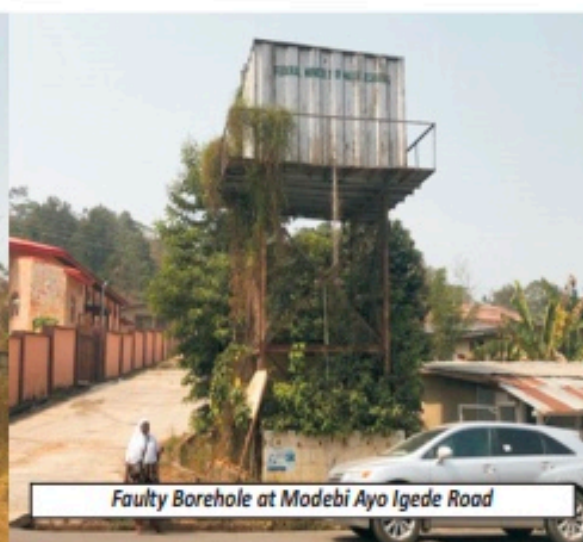

2. Education Sector:

2.1 The Situation of Schools in the Council

Ekiti South West has 63 Public Primary Schools. 25 primary schools are located in Ilawe-Ekiti, while Igbara-Odo and Ogotun both have 19 primary schools each. It has approximately 9, 105 pupils comprising 4,779 girls and 4,286 boys.

It has 10 public secondary schools. 4 of the schools are located in Ilawe while 3 each are located in Igbara-Odo and Ogotun. It has approximately 6,828 students, comprising 3,111 girls and 3,717 boys.

Major Economic challenges experienced by communities in the LGA

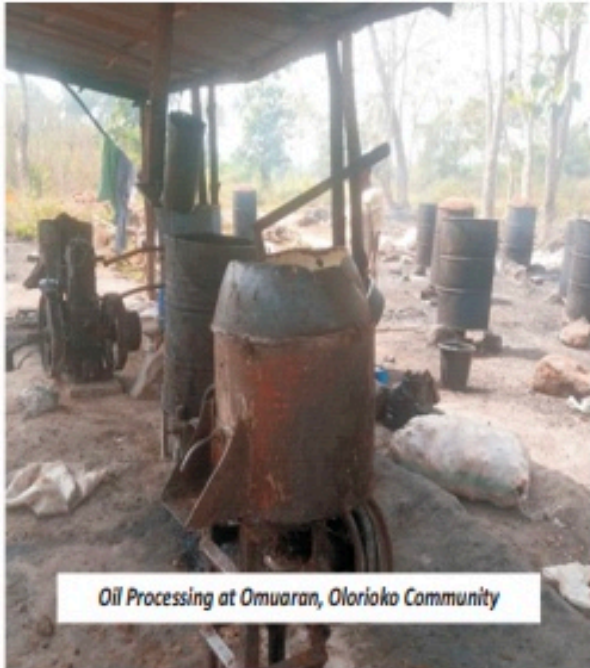
- Lack of access to soft loans and credit facilities
