

Introduction

This Community Development Plan (2024 – 2026) of Moba Local Government Area (LGA) outlines the vision and development needs of the communities in the LGA. The Plan was developed through a collaborative effort of the LGA and community leaders. It outlines community needs and projects in the following areas: Water and Sanitation, Education, Health, Local Economy, Basic Infrastructure (Roads), and Security.

Benefits of the Community Development Plan

- * It helps the government to:
 - o Know the real needs of the people;
 - o understand the priority needs of the different communities; the various competing needs of the different communities that the government needs to prioritise when allocating resources for projects;
 - o wisely allocate government funds;
- * It makes it easier for the LGA and the state government to prepare their annual budgets;
- * It makes it easier for both the local government and the state government to harmonise their development efforts in the communities to avoid duplication of projects.
- * It reduces the siting of unsustainable projects in communities;
- * Communities and the LGA can use the plan to solicit for support for projects from prominent sons and daughters of the communities, corporate bodies, foundations and philanthropists.
- * Communities can also use the plan to engage their elected representatives to pick their constituency projects from the real needs captured in the Plan;
- * The Plan will help the LGA create a sense of belonging for members of the community, as they work together with government to solve their problems.

Brief Profile of Moba Local Government

Moba Local Government is in Ekiti North Senatorial district of Ekiti State. It has a land mass of 378² km and a population of 146,496 (2006 census). Moba Local Government has its administrative headquarters in Otun-Ekiti. It formerly included the present Ilejemeje Local Government before it was carved out of it in 1996.

Majority of its inhabitants engage in farming. The major agricultural produce is: yam, cassava, maize, cashew, oil palm, groundnut and kolanut. Other economic activities that thrive Moba are: trading, tailoring, carpentry, hairdressing, crafts farming and goat rearing. Moba is the leading producer of sugarcane in Ekiti state.

How the Plan was developed

A team of volunteers made up of Grassroots Community Leaders and Local Government Officials (Directors of Budget and Community Development) in the LGA were trained by our technical partner, Community Life Project (CLP), on how to carry out participatory needs assessment.

The needs assessment was carried out over 3 weeks in 13 communities in the LGA. The communities are:

The Team went around the communities and carried out Focus Group Discussions and In-Depth Interviews with different stakeholders to collate the pressing needs of the communities. The stakeholders that helped to identify the needs of the communities include: Oba, Council Chiefs, youths, women, Persons with Disabilities, Artisans, workers, health workers and teachers.

The LGA team also visited health facilities and schools to ascertain the conditions of the facilities.

A Validation Workshop was organised to review the needs collected by the Needs Assessment Team. Present at the workshop were representatives of State Ministries, Departments, and Agencies, as well as the Community Needs Assessment Team.

1.2 The Waste Disposal in Moba LGA

There is need for a proper waste disposal system in communities within the LGA.

To dispose of their waste, Communities engage in any of the 3 ways: Burning, dumping in the bushes, or placing them on the road for the government to pick them up.

Concerning human waste, there is need to ensure all households have proper toilets. Some households in the communities still use pit toilets while some others practice open defecation.

1.3 Waste Disposal Needs

- Sensitisation of citizens on proper waste disposal process
- Set up mobile courts to prosecute offenders
- Build public toilets in strategic places like markets, shopping malls
- Waste Collection Centres are needed in the LGA [where the LG can pick up collected waste]
- Waste disposal vehicles

5. Local Economy

The economic activities of communities in Moba LGA include farming (including poultry fishing), petty trading, and artisan works such as tailoring and carpentry.

The Farm produce includes yam, maize, rice, coco-yam, beans, tomatoes, pepper, okra, vegetables, oranges, banana, plantain, pineapple, cassava, cocoa, palm oil, cashew, kolanuts.

6. Security

6.1 The Security Situation in the LGA

Security of lives and property is a major responsibility of government. It is needed to keep the peace going; without which there can be no meaningful development.

Only 2 communities – Igogo and Ikun out of the 25 communities have any form of security.

The other communities have resorted to self-help initiatives - relying on local hunters and providing personal security.
